We thank God for His gracious leading that allowed me to take early retirement in June. CALLING TO NEW MISSION

At the 2025 JMC, the message on "The Heart of Mission" rekindled the passion I once had—to submit myself to God's calling in mission. By God's wonderful arrangement, we also met Rev. Keynes Kan, who invited us to Malaysia. There, we embarked on a journey that beautifully wove together history and mission, and we were blessed with the opportunity to visit all five CAC churches across West Malaysia.

THE HERITAGE & SITUATION OF THE ALLIANCE MISSIONARY

Malaysia's population is about 35.6 million, with 23% Chinese. In West Malaysia, there are only five Chinese Alliance churches. The first, Puchong Alliance Church, was founded in 1997 and later planted Yeung Yan, Chung Chu, and Living Water churches around Kuala Lumpur.

Surprisingly, the Alliance first arrived much earlier—in 1939, when Rev. Robert A. Jaffray led the founding of Lipis Christian Church. After World War II, it became independent but has since rediscovered its roots and rejoined the Alliance family as the fifth Chinese Alliance church in West Malaysia.



GRADTITUDE FOR THE TRIP AND FUTURE DIRECTION

We thank God for the precious opportunity to preach during this trip and to share the gospel of Jesus Christ at two Mid-Autumn Festival evangelistic gatherings. Our hearts are filled with gratitude for the warm hospitality of the brothers and sisters in the churches there. They sincerely invited us to return—and even expressed the hope that we might stay—to help shepherd, strengthen, and further develop the Kuala Lipis Christian Church, founded by Rev. Robert A. Jaffray.
